





Decision Architecture


 We all need to consider the structure and context in which decisions are made.






Noise

- Unwanted variability in judgements that should ideally be identical... (Kahneman et al, 2021).
- Systematic Bias vs Noise.

Collaboration = Safer Practice

Mechanisms

- Shared mental models collaboration fosters common understanding, reducing interpretive variability.
- Diverse perspectives collaboration counteracts individual bias (e.g. availability bias and anchoring).
- Structured deliberation encourages transparency and accountability in decision-making.

Specific Examples:

- **Pattern Noise** Systematic differences in how different individuals or groups make judgements even when faced with the same information.
- Anchoring Bias The tendency to rely too heavily on an initial piece of information (the anchor) when making decisions even if arbitrary or irrelevant. Group collaboration can help dilute the influence of early anchors.



Decision Architecture

Nudging towards higher standards and safer care.

'Regulators can shape professional behaviour not only through rules and enforcement, but by designing decision environments that reduce noise, align values and nudge towards excellence.'


